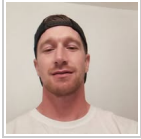

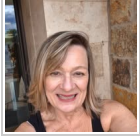
“ I only knew David through youtube and the book "The Radioactive Boy Scout" and was intrigued by his life and pursuits. My condolences to the family for their loss.

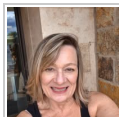
I would occasionally get letters from him and I would also write. My letters always ended up sounding like a "mother" to him giving him encouragement and advice.

God Bless David and God Bless Ken, Kathy, Diana and Kristina for all they have done for David and being there as his loving family.

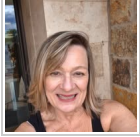
We will all miss David and His unique personality very much!

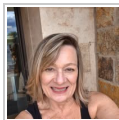

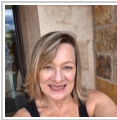
