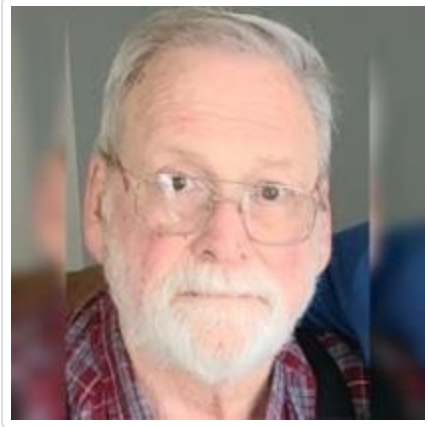




Robert Rae Slate
